

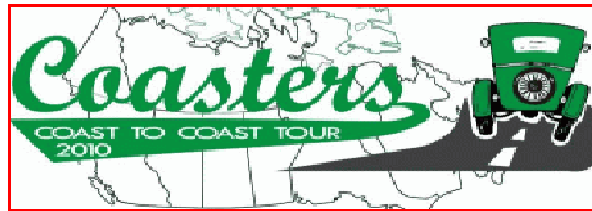

2010 Coast-to-Coast Tour Manitoba Route August 4-8 2010

Note that everything that is highlighted in red can be accessed on the internet.

Wednesday August 4 A contingent of the MCAAC (not necessarily Keystone Circle Tour members) meet the Coasters at the Manitoba Welcome Centre near West Hawk Lake and escort them via Hwy 44 (now signed as the Old No. 1) to **Beausejour** for a luncheon at the **Sun Gro Centre** then to Lockport to view the **St. Andrews locks** and the **Lower Fort Garry**.

Thursday Aug 5 and Friday Aug 6 Activities will be in Winnipeg for the Coasters and any MCAAC member who wishes to attend. If space is an issue, Coasters will be given priority. Participating Coasters will be bussed to the activities. Admission and transportation fees will apply and tickets will be available by advance sale only. More to follow at a later date.

Thursday: A trip on the **Prairie Dog Central**, the oldest operating steam powered train in North America. Limit for this activity is 300 people.

Friday: A river cruise on one of the **Paddlewheel River Boats**. Limit for this activity is 400 people.

Each evening: A three pavilion tour of **Folklorama**, the largest and longest running multi-cultural event of its' kind in the world.

Saturday Aug 7 The circle tour members and coasters marshal at the Travellers RV Resort and head to **Heaman's Autorama** in Carman to view a unique private collection of vehicles and lunch. After noon, we head for the town of **Cypress River** which will host a show of local collector cars followed by a barbecue and an evening of music by a live band.

Sunday Aug 8 Morning dedicated to worship of one's choice and brunch or lunch on our own (a list of nearby churches will be made available). After noon, Tourers and Coasters head to Pipestone where we say our goodbyes. The Coasters will continue on to Estevan, SK while the Tourers go north to Elkhorn.

After noon, we head for the town of **Cypress River** which will host a show of local collector cars followed by a barbecue and an evening of music by a live band.

Sunday Aug 8 Morning dedicated to worship of one's choice and lunch on our own. After noon, we head to Pipestone where we say our goodbyes to the Coasters who will continue on to Estevan, SK. Circle tour members then go to the **Manitoba Automobile Museum** in Elkhorn then to Virden for a potluck supper and evening singsong/campfire activity.

Monday Aug 9 It's off to Shoal Lake to visit the **Shoal Lake Police and Pioneer Museum**, and the **Prairie Mountain Regional Museums Collection** which encompasses the **Clegg Carriage Museum**.

Tuesday Aug 10 Drive to Dauphin and the **Ukrainian Folk Arts Centre and Museum** or Selo Ukraina and/or the **Dauphin Railway Museum**.

Wednesday Aug 11 Head to Neepawa and take a lunch break and visit the **Margaret Laurence Home**. Then we steam to Portage La Prairie's Island Park for supper and an evening with local car enthusiasts.

Thursday Aug 12 Travel to Selkirk and the **Marine Museum of Manitoba** and/or the **Lower Fort Garry**. Lunch is at the Half Moon in Lockport after which we break off and head home.

Keystone Circle Tour

Rules of Eligibility

Preamble: Whereas Keystone Circle Tour is an official function of the Manitoba Classic and Antique Auto Club (MCAAC) and in order to maintain the integrity of this club, the following Rules of Eligibility will apply to all entrants.

1. Open to all 'old car' hobbyists and enthusiasts who pay the prescribed entry fee and whose tour vehicle complies with the following restrictions.
2. Entrant must tour with an original vehicle of pre-1986 vintage.
3. "Original" means as manufactured except that non-original modifications intended to increase safety such as laminated glass, signal lights, seat belts, radial tires, air conditioning, mirrors, visors, CB radios and other such devices agreed to by the Tour Committee Chairman (TCC) will be allowed.
4. Motor vehicles retrofitted with a newer engine may be allowed provided that the engine is of the same make as the vehicle. An exception, at the exclusive discretion of the TCC, may be made for a vehicle commonly referred to as an 'orphan' with no known source of modern engines. In no case will an engine be allowed which is not in keeping with the spirit of the vehicle and the MCAAC legacy.
5. Motor vehicles retrofitted with an automatic transmission and/or other device used by a handicapped person to drive will be allowed provided that the driver is, in fact, handicapped. An exception may also be made for a person of advanced age or who has had hip or knee replacement surgery. Again, the TCC has the final say.
6. No street rods, hotrods, rat rods, resto-rods, customs, etcetera are allowed unless they were built prior to 1961 and have remained intact since.
7. Vehicles with cosmetic non-original add-ons such as seat covers, modern wheels, spinner wheel covers, baby moons, lake pipes, continental kits, fender skirts, fuzzy dice and the like are allowed.
8. Eligible vehicles include cars, trucks, motor homes, house trailers, camper trailers, semi-tractors and trailers, buses, vans and motorcycles but not farm, construction, railway or military equipment that cannot be licensed for road travel in Manitoba.
9. Eligible vehicles may tow a modern trailer or be accompanied by a modern companion vehicle such as a motor home or van.

10. Vehicles 1932 model year or older with four cylinders or less may be trailered or flat towed but must be in operating condition, licensed and able to participate in parades and events.

11. The speed limit on the tour will be the speed of the slowest vehicle.



Entry Fee (includes spouse or guest and minor children):

MCAAC member \$100
 MAAC, NAACC or AACA member \$175
 Non-member \$200
 Deduct \$25 if payment is made before November 30, 2009.
 Add \$25 if payment is made after April 30, 2010.

Payment must accompany registration form and be made by cheque or money order only. Cash will not be accepted and no receipts will be issued. Your cancelled cheque or money order stub will be your receipt.

 The postmark will serve as proof of your payment date.

Payment will be deposited as soon as practicable after receipt. No post-dated cheques please. No registration will be accepted after June 30, 2010. Participants of the 2010 Coast-to-Coast Tour are exempt from the entry fee but must return a completed registration form by April 30, 2010. In all cases, deposits for events, accommodations and/or meals may be required.

MCAAC Membership is \$38 per year. Persons applying for MCAAC membership need not own a classic or antique automobile. Please see MCAAC website for membership application.

Other Options: Persons who wish to be on the tour but do not own an eligible vehicle may rent or borrow one or double up with someone on the tour in order to participate. Adult persons or couples who wish to double up with a participant must pay a separate entry fee.

Need to know:

Although the entry fee ensures that you may participate in the tour, drunken or disorderly conduct (as determined by the TCC) may result in your expulsion from the tour without refund of either the entry fee or deposits. For obvious concerns regarding the safety and security of other tour participants and the public at large, consumption of alcoholic beverages will not be permitted prior to the tour stopping for the day.

Nice To Know:

The entry fees collected will be used to administer the tour and to defray expenses incurred by the MCAAC for such things as dry runs, souvenir purchases, video and photographic recording, tour books and other such expenses associated with the tour which, at the discretion of the Tour Committee and its parent, the MCAAC 50th Anniversary Committee, may or may not occur. Any shortfall in these expenses will be covered by the MCAAC. If, after all expenses have been covered, a surplus occurs, a formal motion will be made by the TCC at a regular general meeting of the MCAAC to remit this money to Winnipeg Harvest.

One More Thing:

Tour participants are not obligated to do the whole tour and may enter or leave the tour at any point. Except at the discretion of the TCC for compassionate reasons, the following refund policy will apply:

No rebate or refund of fees or deposits will be given to participants who start late or leave early. Participants may cancel prior to November 30, 2009 to obtain a full refund. Participants may cancel prior to April 30, 2010 to obtain a 50% refund. Participants may cancel prior to June 30, 2010 to obtain a 25% refund. Participants who cancel after June 30, 2010 will receive no refund.
